Questions for Ted Levin interview:

1. I would like to tell you about Harbour School which I attend:

I am an autistic 11th grader.

Autism refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication. There are types of autism, but we have unique strengths and challenges such as getting sensory overload. Many autistic people are very smart intellectually.

The school's mission is to provide a supportive, caring and individualized education to students with learning disabilities, autism, speech and language impairments and other disabilities in grades one through 12. The program is tailored to meet the

individual needs of the child rather than asking the child to adapt to an existing program. My learning style dictates my program.

2. I would like to tell you about the Technology Academy that I am in at Harbour School.

I had to apply to and be accepted to a specialized program called Technology

Academy. Since Harbour School prepares us for careers, the Technology teaches

us and has us do projects using technology such as video production, which is why

I am doing this video project which combines my interest in politics and

technology. This project helps me develop my speech, language, writing, and

social interaction skills besides learning video recording and editing. I received

mentoring from Maximum Impact Media, a nonprofit which provides media education and services. It provides education in the same way that Harbour School does by educating in the way that I learn and by my needs.

I am interested in politics, Torah study, and demographics. The Torah is the Jewish Bible. I hope that I can have a career in demographics. I did another project about the demographics of the Baltimore Jewish community which is in another video that I made with the mentoring of Maximum Impact Media, a nonprofit.
